Major Superior's Message on the Foundation Day

Dear Brothers,

Greetings in our Lord Jesus Christ. July 16, 2020 is indeed very special for us because we are celebrating the 171st birthday of our congregation, 1st anniversary of the erection of Kolkata as Independent Delegation and the conclusion of the Golden Jubilee of our presence in India. Of course, we are also commemorating this year the 150th anniversary of the death of our Founder which we will solemnly celebrate on Oct 24. All these elevate our spirits and make us joyful. In some houses we have started novena to prepare ourselves for the celebration. But spike in COVID-19 cases everywhere in India can dampen our enthusiasm and, in many states, July 16 will be spent under strict lockdown. How shall we then best live this graceful day? We are carrying in our hearts those who suffer from this pandemic in different ways while feeling one with them and we take them daily to the altar, the mercy seat of God. This has definitely made our hearts more spacious and compassionate. One lesson the pandemic has taught to humanity is "humility" in front of the vast creation and the creator, bringing us to our knees in a deep realization of helplessness and utter bankruptcy. The mighty political, financial and scientific powers are shaking below the knees. What has happened to us is an unplanned globalization of hearts levelling down the evil effects of market-globalization well planned and cunningly carried out, based purely on brain intelligence and covetousness. On the contrary, the creation is sustained more by heart intelligence which is humble, obedient to the will of God and more global in connectivity with other hearts. As missionaries we need to globalise this "heart-power" to realise a "New Creation" in post-pandemic days, a creation moved by compassion, honesty, love, simple life-style, contemplation and above all humility which are found in the Immaculate Heart whose true sons we are..

Humility for our founder is "the foundation of all other virtues" (Aut. 341). He writes the following after he received the inspiration to found the congregation in prayer, saying to God and the Blessed Virgin, "Aided by your grace, and the companions you have destined for me, I shall found this congregation - of which I shall be the last of all and the servant of all. Hence, I shall kiss their feet and wait upon them at table, and count myself most fortunate in rendering them these services" (Mss. Claret II, 9). Our congregation's foundation stone is this deep humility which propels us to missionary service to the needy, imitating Jesus who washed the feet of his disciples. Humility is a state of mind in which ego takes the last seat and pride has no seat. In our spiritual journey we need to cultivate carefully the humility and meekness of Jesus (Mt 11:29) in order to be effective servants of the Word.

On completion of 50 years of Claretian service in India, as Independent Delegation we have journeyed together as one family one full year and we are very grateful to God and our Mummy, the immaculate heart for the graces received. We thank our Founder St. Anthony Mary Claret, our brother martyrs and our Co. Patroness St. Teresa of Calcutta for all their spiritual supports. Our family spirit is growing, our missionary commitment is maturing, our administrative machineries are being well-oiled. Thanks to the pandemic, we were pushed into e-pastoral ministry; our Sunday sermons in Hindi in youtube are picking up and soon Hindi discourses on Bible will be uploaded. Our mission procure activities are very encouraging. While rejoicing in all these we also realise that we need to deepen our spirituality to the level in which we remain "Christ-centred" always like our Founder; that our communion in the community living is ego-free and life-giving; that our missionary commitment is manifest in our humble and fervent approach to our needy brethren, sacrificing everything for the well-being of others especially the poorest of the poor. May God and our Mummy lead us to that depth! May I wish you all a Happy Foundation Day!

4. SILVER JUBILEE OF BISHRAIL MISSION

On 23rd February 2020, St. Anthony Mary Claret Parish, celebrated Silver Jubilee of Claretian presence in Bishrail in the diocese of Raiganj, West Bengal, India. The Holy Eucharistic Celebration began at 9:30 am with solemn procession dance by parishners from Claret Seva Sadan (community residence) to the newly built Parish Church.



Rt. Rev. Fulgence Aloysius Tigga, D.D., the bishop of Raiganj was the main Celebrant. Rev. Fr. V. Lawrence CMF, Major Superior of Kolkata Independent Delegation and Rev.

Fr. Paulus Marandi, Vicar General of Diocese of Raiganj were the co-celebrants; besides, there were 17 Claretian priests, 33 religious and diocesan priests working in the diocese of Raiganj, 25 nuns and around 700 faithful were present to witness the great historical events. Mr. Daniel Mandi, one of the village catechists read out the history of Bishrail mission and the names of the priests and nuns who worked for the growth of this mission. Mahila sangh (women group) welcomed the main celebrant and co-celebrants traditionally by washing their feet.



The bishop welcomed Fr. V. Lawrence, cmf, to cut the ribbon and gave the church key to Rev. Fr. Martin Soren, Cmf, the parish priest of St. Claret Parish, Bishrail to open the church door for all

to make an entry. The entire congregation was led to the church by the Santhali entrance dance. Rev. Fr Paulus Marandi, the Vicar General gave thought provoking sermon and thanked the Claretian Congregation for opting to work among the Santhals. In his sermon, he mentioned about the works, commitment and total dedication of Claretian missionaries for the emancipation of the local children by providing the facilities of English medium school, hostels and health centre. Thereafter, the altar, tabernacle, entrance doors were anointed with chrism oil, blessed and incensed.

At the end of the Holy Mass, Fr Martin Soren Cmf, the parish priest proposed the vote of thanks to the bishop, priests and nuns. He too



thanked the faithful and the donors for their generous contributions to build the church. Finally, he thanked the community members for their support and guidance to take up this great task, mainly Rev. Fr. G. Sony John, CMF,

for supervising the construction work and his role in fund collection. Soon after the Holy Eucharistic celebration, there was a colorful cultural program to felicitate the guests. 10. CLARET DEEP, LALPUR

Nirmal Sadan at Ghatsila in Jharkhand is in an industrial township. Local migrant families depend upon their daily wages in these factories. They couldn't proceed to their home due to the lockdown. Our community members took initiative to supply provisions to the needy families around them.



Claret Seva Sadan at Bishrail is situated in a badly flood affecting area. Here many families survive on daily wages and through bamboo products making. They do not have fields of



their own. In the lockdown a number of families have been struggling for their daily livelihood. Our community identified the poor and needy villagers and reached out to 160 families with rations and other food provisions on regular basis. The community took care of 70 migrant laborers who reached back to their village.

11. RELIEF WORKS: COVID-19 & AMPHAN

Coronavirus pandemic has shaken the World. In many countries it has gone beyond control. Doctors, nurses and other health and essential services staff are on the front line fighting against the deadly virus risking their own lives to save others. It has heavily come down on the poor, migrant workers and on our economy. The Government of India announced 1st Phase full lock down from 24th March to 14th April 2020 for 21 days, likewise there were 5 lockdowns, still we find the situation very grim and cases are increasing day by day in an alarming rate.

Nishkalanka Bhavan at Sarangloya in Lapung of Jharkhand is a new mission based in a remote place of Ranchi district. From here lot of people go to the nearby towns in search of jobs/works, while others have migrated to big towns like Ranchi, Khunti, Jamshedpur and other big cities. Due to lockdown these workers have come back to their villages with very little income. Aware of this situation, our missionaries identified 15 poor families and distributed food provisions to them on regular basis.



As soon as the news about the Global spread of Covid-19 and lockdown in India was announced, the Kolkata Delegation Council decided to join hands with the governments in relief work through the Mission Procure of the Claretian Society, Kolkata. Emphasizing on the dos' and don'ts for doing relief work, personnel were asked to follow the government guidelines like wearing masks, using sanitizer, hand washing as well as maintaining social distancing while doing relief work.

FOOD PROVISION DISTRIBUTIONS

Claret Deep at Lalpur in Ranchi found a lot of daily labourers and small business families around their community struggling to find daily livelihood. Along with the Claretians, youth of the parish joined together to reach out to them to distribute food provisions for 509 families.



Claret Vidyaniketan at Nayasara in Ranchi is situated in a place where there are a lot of migrant workers who could not proceed to their homes. Our missionaries found some daily laborers with no income. The community is reaching out to 28 deserving poor families with groceries and other food provisions.



Marsal Sadan at Sahanager, under Burdwan district has a lot of migrant workers of paddy and potato cultivation from Jharkand, Bihar and other parts of West Bengal around it. Because of the sudden lockdown they couldn't proceed to their homes and have been living in huts in open fields. Through our initiatives and with the help of Sisters of Friends of



Claret Gyanalaya at Masagram in Burdwan district is just beside the Delhi -Kolkata national high way. The land surrounding this place is very fertile for paddy and potato cultivation.

Migrant laborers have come from Jharkhand and other districts of the west Bengal for cultivation and harvest. Many families had no means to meet both the ends during the lockdown. Our community is reaching out to 11 poor migrant families with food provisions.

Food-Packet Distribution Responding to the needs of the poor around the community of Claret Nivas at Barrackpore, our students community daily distributed food packets of two meals for 30 individuals (beggars, homeless, mentally and physically challenged) during 1st and 2nd phases of lockdown. Now these persons have been linked to some NGOs.

Amphan Relief Work at Nazat - Sundarbans: The Eastern Indian city of Kolkata has been devastated by a powerful cyclone which killed at least 84 people across India and Bangladesh. No doubt our Sundarban also became the victim of this tragedy. In the past,

people of this area have witnessed to the cyclones like Aila' in 2009, Titti in 2018 and Bulbul in 2019. People have just recovered and settled from the last



cyclone. Again, on 20th May 2020, the Amphan super cyclone hit very badly the state of West Bengal, mainly the districts of Haldia, Howrah, Hooghly, North and South 24 Parganas. Amphan made landfall lashing our area with ferocious wind and rain. Thousands of trees were uprooted in the gales, electricity lines brought down and houses flattened. The cyclone along with the rain destroyed most of the mud houses, crops, fishes, livestock. Fishery is the main cultivation of this area and for many days this area was surrounded by water. It has brought great damage to the thousands of families in the Sundarban delta. The Government of West Bengal and other NGOs are very



actively involved in the relief work by distributing food grains, meals, drinking water, medicine and tarpaulin to cover their houses.

Claret Premaloy, Nazat studied the situation and made a quick response to the suffering and the needy by reaching out to them differently but diligently. We are grateful to Fr. V. Lawrence, CMF, Major Superior and his council for having accompanied us in this time of calamity. As per the direction of the council, Fr. Raimund Tigga, CMF, the prefect of Apostolate was kind enough to visit the affected areas and had urgent meeting with the community and the parish council members.



In the meeting we heard the sharing from each parish council member and based on their sharing we could figure out the urgent needs of the people that were not provided by the

government and other NGO's. So, we decided to repair their damaged houses by distributing bamboos, asbestos sheets, sand, cement and bricks to the families in dire need. We also focused on our



Catholic Families of Tushkali, Dheknamari, Balirkhal and Nazat in the district of North 24th Parganas. So far 32 families have been benefited from us. The work is in progress. We are very much grateful to Kolkata Delegation team for their love and concern towards the mission. Fr. Raimund Tigga, CMF

12. FAITH WITNESS

This is the faith story of a couple who belongs to the parish Nazat where I am the parish priest. They are Mr. Dayal and Mrs. Kabita Mana who astonished me during my post Amphan visit to their house when they shared how God saved them during the cyclone.



As soon as they got the news about the cyclone Amphan on 19th May 2020 which would be going to hit the state of West Bengal, mainly Sundarban Islands on the following day, they thought that it would come and go as any other usual rain activity. They never imagined that it would be so violent and destructive. When it finally reached it was so severe but they did not want to leave their house, livestock and move away from there, thinking that they would be able to tackle it.



Gradually, the cyclone became stronger and stronger that they lost communication with others. Neither they could go out nor receive help from others. In no time everything was destroyed outside around them. They saw the roofs of other houses flying, walls getting collapsed. People in those houses had already moved from their mud houses to the nearby well- built temple. But they did not suffer panic but in strong faith said that Jesus would save them and so they preferred to remain at home. The cyclone started around 5.00 pm and continued till 11.00 pm at night. During these Six hours they spent their time in prayer asking God's aid trusting in his protective powerful hands.

As the cyclone was calming down, they had meal and went to bed. Early in the morning, when they got up, they saw destruction everywhere, river was overflowing, water had entered in all houses. Some of the houses were completely washed out. But to their surprise their house was left untouched, it was only surrounded by water. All the same, they were very sad to see the damages suffered by their neighbors who lost their houses, cattle, crops and fishery. They were recent believers in Christ, who were kicked out from their family due to their Christian faith and they found a place to build a small house for them on the river bank and indeed their house is built on the rock of faith!
